If you missed Golden Love' presentation on Water Neutral Gardening at our March meeting, you can see the PowerPoint presentation on his website, and other resources he mentioned in his talk (https://lovesgardens.com/resources/). Golden has moved and embarked on a new botanical adventure at 1955 Encina Drive, Santa Cruz. "We will be removing a lot of concrete and asphalt and are waiting on permits from the County to do this. It will be a demonstration garden with many fruiting trees, shrubs, perennials and vines; raised beds made with broken concrete; a cob studio; infiltration galleries and basins to store water in the ground and so much more. Our first free on-site workshop "Residential Rainwater Harvesting" will be Sunday, May 7, 1-5 pm. We will be installing rain barrels in series along the side of our house."

### WANT TO LEARN HOW TO HARVEST RAINWATER? THIS WORKSHOP IS FOR PEOPLE WHO WANT TO BUILD RESILIENCE IN THEIR GARDENS WITH WATER STORED AROUND THEIR HOME

We will start with a short talk at 1 pm. Then Golden Love will lead the group in assembling a series of rain barrels along the



side of the house. The installation will include the latest techniques for easily installing hose bibs, intake, over flow, and equalizer tubes. Golden will share about the process of routing the overflow from the system into infiltration basins and galleries for in-ground water storage. He will also cover how to plumb the rain barrels into a gravity fed irrigation system to water plants.



Join in the fun of conserving water, saving money, and engaging in protecting our aquifers. Handouts will be available.

## May is National Salad Month: Lettuce Celebrate!

Spring produce abounds, so try tossing together some sugar snap peas, some greens (lettuce, arugula or spinach) and some quartered or halved strawberries. Dress with equal parts extra-virgin olive oil, balsamic vinegar and freshsqueezed lemon juice, a little water, grated lemon zest, a bit of salt and black pepper. Garnish with thinly sliced fresh basil and fresh torn mint. Aaahhh!

Please don't bring loose, dirty plants that would make a mess, or plants you wouldn't be proud to put your name on.

We appreciate all of you who come early to help set up - it's
a lot of work! And if you can, plan on staying to help with
clean-up.

We'll start accepting plants at 6:40 p.m. The purchase prices are:

- · 2", 3", or 4" pots: 2 tickets or \$1 each
