

TOMATO MASTERS CLASS

Last year we were very fortunate to have farmer and gueen-of-all-things-tomato Cynthia Sandberg speak at a meeting about how to grow tomatoes. Cynthia, cofounder of the World Tomato Society (https://worldtomatosociety.com/aboutpage-tomato-people/)and owner of Love Apple Farms and nursery. She is teaching two of her amazing Tomato Masters workshops, one in April and one in May. You'll want to sign up early, because her classes fill up fast.

Cynthia says, "Learn how to master the art and science of the world's most popular fruit. Follow the growing techniques learned in this workshop to grow 7 foot tall plants that yield 100 pounds of fruit per plant! This is a hands-on seminar on backyard tomato growing. sale brought record sales – thank you loyal plant sale shoppers – that model proved unsustainable, so the team began considering alternative venue options.

Fortunately for us the Cabrillo College Horticulture Department is no stranger to hosting plant sales; many fondly recall their legendary Mother's Day weekend sales which ran for decades. Thanks to

the great partnership with our hosts, we are pleased to announce the Chapter's 2024 Spring Plant Sale will be held at the Cabrillo College Horticulture Center located at the top of campus. Our thanks go out to the Horticulture Department leadership, instructors, and team members involved.

Our Spring Plant Sale will feature a wide range of springtime bloomers including a great selection of annual wildflowers and spring flowering bulbs (*Allium*, *Brodiaea*,

Dichelostemma, Dipterostemon and Triteleia spp.) which provide instant garden color and diversity for pollinators. Many of these annuals and bulbs have been grown from locally sourced seed; look for "We're Local!" signs.

April is rose month in Santa Cruz, so please join us for a springtime class on getting started with and growing roses. This class will be a lively discussion on growing roses in the home garden, appropriate whether you intend to grow one, 10, or 100 roses. For while scale matters, the basics are the same. Visualize yourself in your future spring/summer garden, picking and choosing color combinations from a plethora of blooms it all starts now.



This workshop will cover a discussion on the almanac or calendar of the rose year, specifically looking at the following topics:

The run up to planting; looking at site, sun, and soil factors; Harnessing the "3C's": cultivation/tillage, cover crops, and compost to ensure success; Sourcing quality rose plants' Planting container roses;The yearly growth and care cycle of roses.

We will also go on a "gallery walk" where we tour the Chadwick Garden and look at the principal classes of roses; hybrid teas, grandifloras, floribundas, David Austin roses, and a myriad of other varieties being grown

Led by our own experienced rose grower and organic gardening instructor Orin Martin, this workshop takes place in the historic Alan Chadwick Garden at UC Santa Cruz. Early spring is a time to focus on the most active vertebrate pests - gophers, birds and deer - who can do significant damage in a short period of time.

Join UC Master Gardeners Delise Weir and Trink Praxel to learn how IPM strategies can be used to control these specific pests. We will cover the basic steps of IPM which help you identify the pest and its impact, learn various control options available, and find the least toxic approach that will work.
